Note from the Pastor



BAPTISM AND THE DEPENDENT CLAUSES

There are three births critical to our existence. The first is our birth into physical life. The last is our birth into eternal life. But the one that affects us the most while we are here is our rebirth in Baptism. Today we celebrate the feast of Jesus' Baptism where His true identity is made manifest. Now He knows who He truly is. He is not just the carpenter's son or Mary's boy but He is the Son of God.

But what does it mean to be the Son of God? That's what Jesus had to discover in the desert when He fasted for 40 days and was tempted by the devil. What He knew when He came out of that desert was that to be the Son of God did not mean to dominate creation or control it but to love it and to liberate it by being willing to enter into the suffering of all of creation. And with that He sets the pattern for all who are to follow Him. That's us.

John the Baptist proclaimed that the one who follows Him, the Christ, would baptize us with fire and the Holy Spirit. The fire burns off the dross to reveal the gold of the Holy Spirit. We who are baptized in His name are called, therefore, to follow the same pattern that He set for us. St. Paul puts it this way, "Are you not aware that you who are baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into His death? By baptism into His death we are united with Him so that just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live a new life." That's the pattern. Something has to die so that something can come to life. The old, selfish, fearful one has to give way to the new reality rushing in, the Divine implant of God's grace. This gives us God's power to stand in solidarity with and to love the other.

Of all the Liturgies we celebrate here at Mary Queen, we love nothing more than a Baptism at Mass. We love them for good reason. This is not a Christening with the sprinkling of a few drops of water but a plunging into the mystery of the Christ. And the baby comes out a brand new creation. I love to look at the faces of the people in the pews as I parade around this child with the face of God. All are smiling; some have tears in their eyes knowing that the great Christ mystery has once again been passed on.

And what is that mystery? Emmanuel. God-in-us! And if God is in us through Jesus Christ then we are to do the works of God. And the work of God in Jesus is to stand in solidarity with suffering humanity, to participate in its redemption, and to know that we are all interconnected one with the other. That's what it means to be a baptized Christian and a member of the Body of Christ. It is always a joy to see how this divine inoculation takes, especially in our young people. And this last Christmas we saw it take in a most beautiful form.

With every Baptism we point our children in the direction of the Divine. By our own Christian lives we model for them what this looks like in action. We bring them to church, we tell them the stories, we teach them forgiveness, and, very importantly, how to stand with the poor and suffering of the world just as Christ did. Two weeks ago, two of my most precious little, parishioners, Chloe and Tanya came up to me all excited. They said to me in unison, "Father, we are so excited because last week we went to help with 'Feed My Starving Children'." There it was. The love of the Divine manifested in the littlest hearts. And about a month and a half ago, I was approached by eight fifth grade boys. They too wanted to do something special.

The boys wanted to adopt a bunch of children for Christmas. Being the old wizened bureaucrat that I am, I tried to point them in the direction of the Giving Tree. No, No, they wanted to do something very special. And they wanted to do it on their own. Could I find some families for them? I hesitated and asked them how important it was for them to do it this way. Very important. Then do it.

And boy did they do it! They call themselves "The Dependent Clauses." The name came to Andrew Hausoul who was studying dependent clauses in school. What a neat name, he thought. It is, indeed. The dependent clause, just like us, cannot stand on its own. It is not independent. It is dependent upon others for it to work. None of us stands alone. What an incredible lesson. So the boys set out to raise some funds, buy some toys, wrap them up and deliver them. On the Saturday before Christmas, box after box after box of child wrapped clothes and toys and presents were delivered to the rectory. Now that's baptism in action.



In a way, the boys celebrated a mini baptism on that day. They forgot themselves in favor of standing in solidarity with someone else in need. They died to their own selfish desires in order to do something outside of themselves for someone else. Pretty neat.

Now, I am sure that I would not have to look very hard to find what the boys did multiply over and over and over again in our parish. We can begin with the toys that the children collected for Marillac House and money they raise for Heifer International. And the story goes on. Sometimes we worry about how we are passing on the faith to our children. Well, at least on this level it is being passed on quite nicely, thank you very much.
