Note from the Pastor



PASSING THE BATON

Life is not a sprint, it is a long distance race and most often it is a relay race. How wonderful it is that when you come to the end of your leg of the race there is someone to give you a leg up and to receive the baton out of your hand. If you are good runner you keep your eye on your successor because you want to make sure that he has a firm grip on the baton, on the thing that you do, before you let go of it. I am now getting ready to pass the baton.

June 8 will be my last Sunday here at Mary Queen after which I plan to enter into a very active retirement. After a short period of decompression, I will be moving to Big Sur California to live among the Camaldolese Hermits for a number of months. Praying and discerning where God wants me to be and what he wants me to do next will be my primary agenda. But I will not be running or running anything. By then I will have passed the baton.

Today we welcome to Mary Queen one who is eagerly awaiting with heart and hands wide open to receive the baton of priesthood as it is passed on to him. He's Mark Burnhard, a young theologian studying at Mundelein Seminary for the Diocese of Joliet. He speaks to us today about his call from the Lord and his response to that call. He is in eager preparation to run the race. It is with humble joy that I now pass on to him what I have received from those who went before me, the proclamation of the Good News of our Lord, Jesus Christ. In the great *Traditio*, the holy handing on, I pass on to him the Living Word of God. (No, he's not going to be the new pastor of Mary Queen).

During my last sabbatical in 2005 I had the opportunity to speak to all the seminarians at the North American College in Rome. I had the privilege of living among them for the previous three months and could not help but be impressed by their overall goodness, piety and true enthusiasm for the New Evangelization. Many of them saw themselves as Pope John Paul II Catholics and true cultural warriors for the Holy Father's (Benedict had just been elected Pope) desire to purify the Church against what he saw as secularistic, raging relativism throughout all of Europe and, by extension, the rest of the world. 2005 also

saw us in the midst of and the height of the sexual abuse scandal here in America. The scandal in Ireland had not yet exploded but by then the churches were already emptying at a catastrophic rate. Our Irish retreat director told us that the Church in Ireland went from 90% participation on a Sunday down to 10% in just ten years. This was the Church these young men were about to enter into.

As I spoke to them I couldn't help but marvel at the fact that they were very much like the New York firefighters on September, 11th just a few years before. When the whole world was running out of the collapsing buildings, they were running in. When the whole world seemed to be leaving the Church, they were signing up. But as an old codger I had to ask them what were they signing up for? At that time, because the Church was being attacked from all quarters there was a true "circle the wagons" mentality at the seminary. It seemed better to go back to the rather rigid tried and true than to step out and engage the culture on its own terms. And this they did. Every Liturgy was perfect and deadly accurate (as one seminarian said, "with an emphasis on deadly"). One never colored outside the lines. One bowed just so, not too high, not too low, just right. One had to wear just the right kind of cassock produced from the right tailor. After all, these were the elite who had to purify the temple after the pollution of the modern world. Needless to say, I had to challenge that, just a little bit.


Now, don't get me wrong, in almost every way I truly admired these young men and stood in awe of them for their desire to swim against the stream. But it was my desire that if they were to pick up the baton, they would pick up at the right end and so when I finished my talk I gave them a toast, "In good times, may all of your vestments come from Stadelmaier and your beautiful cassocks from the House of Hanson but in all times may you put on Christ Jesus for whom you were tailor made." It is not "what" we are going to pass on to the next generation but "who." Get the "who" right, the identity right and everything else falls into place. The who is Christ, the incarnate love of the Divine in human flesh. And that comes not from being chosen as an elite priest but from our common baptism. We were all baptized into Christ. And that means baptized into His death. That means to let go of all of the trappings that keep us separate from the people we are called to serve. If there is anyone who understands this fully and completely it is our present Holy Father, Francis.

And so dear Mark, young seminarian, follower of the Christ, I pass on the baton to you and to your brothers so that as you are all set aside for sacred duties, ordained, it will grow out of your deepest identity as a child of God who was made manifest at your Baptism when you were anointed with the Sacred Chrism as Priest, Prophet and King.

Now, take this baton from my hand and run with it.

It may ask for restored health or faith for the receiver. The prayers are heartfelt and can be individualized to specific needs.

This is a perfect ministry for compassionate people who can knit, crochet, quilt, measure, sew, cut, and tie, providing a special gift of love. What a great way to give someone a much needed hug at a time when you can't be there yourself.

Ways to Participate:

COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE BISHOP COLLECTION FOR LATIN AMERICA

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Catholics in Latin America and the Caribbean face many challenges when it comes to sharing their faith; yet the light always shines through and hope arises. For example, in the Diocese of San Miguel, El Salvador, the youth of Holy Family Parish are at high risk for violence and gang activity. In response, the parish designed a youth enrichment and leadership program to address young people's need for critical-thinking skills and values education. The parish hopes to help the youth living in these high-vulnerability areas create a culture of solidarity and peace within their neighborhoods. The parish currently engages a group of 75 young adults. They will become youth leaders to spread the gospel message in their neighborhoods and break the cycle of violence.

In Ecuador, the Diocese of Loja organized a three-day formation program for their catechists, many of whom work in isolated areas. More than 2,500 catechists gathered from around the diocese to participate in training sessions on rural ministry, bible instruction, and other areas of catechesis. One of the participants, Andrea, said that the experience was informative and enriching and that the catechists were able to meet each other and share their diverse experiences. She said that the sessions fortified her spirit so that she can go back to her ministry in the parish and better serve the people in the diocese.

The Collection for the Church in Latin America, through projects like these youth and young adult ministry programs, as well as catechesis programs, empowers the faithful of Latin America to deepen their faith and share it with each other and the world.

Our diocese takes up this Collection the weekend of January 25-26, 2014. Please be generous in this Collection and take this opportunity to share your faith with the youth of Latin America and the Caribbean. Your support will truly make a difference. Thank you and God bless you.

SENIORS INVITED TO DEFER PROPERTY TAXES FOR 2013 REAL ESTATE TAXES

Qualified senior citizens aged 65 years and older are invited to apply for the Senior Citizen's Real Estate Tax Deferral Program offered by the State of Illinois through the DuPage County Treasurer's office. This program allows qualified senior citizens to defer up to \$5,000 of their current property tax amount. The deferral is treated as a loan and accrues 6 percent simple interest until the amount is either paid back or the property is sold. To qualify, the senior citizen's household income cannot exceed \$55,000. Additionally, the property must be used exclusively for the owner's primary residence.
