Note from the Pastor



Easter Sunday Resurrexit Sicut Dixit

Resurrexit Sicut Dixit, "He is risen just as He said." For the last 30 years or so I have begun every Easter Sunday note the same. It is what the angel announced to Mary Magdalene when she found the tomb empty and was convinced that Jesus had been taken away. No, He has not been taken away, "He is risen just as He said He would." It is the ultimate 'I told you so.'

Of all the absurdities of life, death seems the most absurd. You are born, you grow, you learn, you work, you love, you live, you produce and then you die (sometimes leaving everything to your ne'er-do-well brother-in-law). The author Qohelith calls this the Vanity of Vanities. And if that is all there is then he is right and death is utterly absurd. Today we are shown there is so much more. From the defeat of death springs the fullness of life. The question is, dare you believe it?

"Okay, I want to believe, but what's the evidence? An empty tomb?" Guards were put at the tomb of Jesus to make sure that the body would not be stolen. The first to arrive on the first day of the week was Mary Magdalene and, depending upon which Gospel version you read, she thinks He has been taken away and feels utterly lost. In the synoptic, she hears the famous phrase, "He is not here, He is risen just as He said." But she has no idea what that means. In John's Gospel she encounters Jesus but does not recognize Him. She thinks He is the gardener. "Sir, if you have taken Him away, tell me where you put Him." And Jesus in His risen state says to her, "Mary." That's all she needs to hear. It is the Lord. He is alive. Oh, how she loved this man and wants to cling to Him. But He says to her, "Do not cling to me, I must go to My Father and your Father." There is something new here, something radically new. It is the fullness of life and Mary knows it. Her heart beats with incredible wonder, confusion and joy. She runs to the apostles and they don't believe her. Peter and the beloved apostles rush out to find an empty tomb as well. Peter doesn't know what is going on, John peeks in and he believes. Obviously, seeing is not believing. Believing is seeing. John believes and sees in his heart the Risen Lord who is now about to appear to him and Peter and the other disciples. This one who was dead is now alive and not only alive but with them. And not only with them but informing them of what life is all about. Death is not the end. It is not absurd. It is simply the passage to life.

And that was Jesus' message all along. "Unless a grain seed dies..." "If you want to live you will have to die..." Oh, dear, all this death stuff. But death is not the final word. Obviously our God is the God of life. But somehow, the fullness of life only comes through death. Go figure. You can't. But once you have experienced this new life, this new creation, you don't need to.

The biggest fear we all have, the fear of dying, is put to rest today. Death is not the end, it is merely a passage to the fullness of life. How do we know? Well, one just like us embraced death on behalf of all of us so that just has He has risen from the dead, we might also.

Do you believe it? The evidence is in and is manifested in the life of the saints for the last 2,000 years. The question for us is dare we, like John, see the empty tomb and believe. Because if we dare to believe, we shall see. We will live forever. Why? Resurrexit Sicut Dixit!

distributed during Mother's Day weekend. If you would like to honor the nurturing women in your life, living or deceased, this is a lovely way to show your appreciation.


