

## Note from the Pastor



This Sunday, the 1<sup>st</sup> Sunday after Easter used to be called 'Low Sunday.' That's because compared to the grandeur of Easter, everything's a bit of a downer. Not anymore. Now it's

'Divine Mercy Sunday.'

Thanks to Saints Pope John Paul II and Faustina, we are all filled with mercy. But then we always were. Of all of God's gifts there is none sweeter than mercy. It is God's free, unearned, unmerited, unwarranted gift that says to us, I set you free. You have a burden unbearable? I take it away. You have a conscious filled with guilt, I wash it clean. What a deal!

There's a wonderful story of a man before a just judge. The man was trembling because he was so guilty. The judge said to him, "Why do you fear? I am a just judge and I promise justice." He replied, "I know your Honor, that's why I'm scared. I know I'll get justice and if I do, I'm a dead man. I don't need justice, I need mercy."

And mercy we shall have for in our God, mercy and justice kiss. God's justice IS mercy. It is the prodigal father killing the fatted calf for his prodigal son. It is the risen Lord bidding peace to his disciples after they betrayed Him.

In today's Gospel we have Mercy personified in the resurrected Christ. I'm so glad I'm not Jesus because if it were I who was abandoned by my disciples, left to die alone and then became victorious over death and showed up to my so called followers, trust me, there would be a day of reckoning. They would get their just desserts, alright, shoved down their throats. I can almost hear myself, "Three years I was with you, teaching you, caring for you, loving you and in my moment of need, where the hell were you? Oh, you're going to pay for this."

And what was the real Jesus' response? What was the first word out of His mouth after having walked through the doors appearing to His trembling disciples? "SHALOM!! PEACE!!" And then he said it again!

And if that wasn't enough, after he held nothing against them, He gave them a gift. The best gift of all

– His own Divine Mercy, the power to do what He just did.

When He had said this, he showed them His hands and side. The disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you." And when He said this He breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. Whose sins you shall forgive are forgiven then, and whose sins you retain are retained."

God's mercy, His unconditional grace and love are now given to us to distribute as we please. The gift is ours to give or not to give. But woe to us who choose not to give it. For if we choose to hold on to an offense, to retain a sin, we are now once again held in captivity and re-enter into the sin from which we have just been forgiven. It's God's little catch 22. (He does have such a sense of humor).

So, now that you have this divine power, this Divine Mercy, how are you going to use it? Know anybody who can use a little unmerited grace? Unearned forgiveness? Give it away and watch it come back 30, 60, 100 fold.




