Note from the Pastor

Blessed Golden Jubilee, Sister Marlene, SLW

The year was 1964, the Beatles sang on Ed Sullivan, Lyndon Johnson was in the White House, Gilligan's Island had just premiered and young Marlene Geimer was entering the convent. Oh, there was something else going on that year, it was called Vatican Council, II. A few years before a rotund, jolly pope named John XXIII shocked the world (not to mention members of the Roman Curia) by announcing that it was time to open the windows of the Church and let in a little fresh air. He called it aggiornamento. This was the very first ecumenical council in the Catholic Church that was not in response to some heresy or crisis in the Church. As a matter of fact, he called it at a time when God was in His Heaven and all was right with the world. The Second World War was over as was Korea, the economy was beginning to boom worldwide, the convents were filled as were the seminaries.

In those days, one never passed a church without tipping one's hat and if you lived in Chicago, it was impossible to get a speeding ticket if you wore a collar or a habit. In 1964, young Marlene Geimer received the habit of the Sisters of Christian Charity and took the name Sister Jolene (and she hasn't been caught for speeding ever since).

For the next 11 years, Sister Jolene went to school and then did what many religious sisters did in those days, became a teacher. In 1975 she also went back to her Baptismal name, Marlene, as so many sisters did at that time because the Sacrament of our identity is Baptism. And besides, her older sister, Eileen, who took the religious name Marlene now had to go back to her baptismal name, Eileen.

By the late 60's both the world and the Church were in turbulent times. The Vietnam War was raging, riots were breaking out all over, hemlines were going up and hairlines going down (and we dared to call it the Age of Aquarius).

In the Church there were sea changes as well. The most obvious ones took place on a Sunday morning at Mass. The altars were turned around, Latin was replaced by the vernacular (would that we could use it today) and most importantly, the altar railing that separated the people from the Sacred, from the Divine, from God was taken down. The Church itself was now seen not so much as only a hierarchal structure but as the People of God.

Another ostensible change came in religious life. No one took the faith life of the Church or the dictates of Rome more seriously than American religious sisters. So when the Council asked them to go out into the world to be witnesses of the Gospel, they did. They came out of the



cloistered convent, learned how to drive and many went out to work with the people where they were. This was a true change of habit and so consequently, many of them changed their habits in order to be more accessible to the people. There was even an Elvis Presley movie celebrating it called, "Change of Habit."



Now, obviously, for every action there is a reaction. Many people wanted to sisters to stay "in their place."

I remember at the time Paul Harvey lamenting the fact that the "good sisters" were abandoning their habits and being watered down in the ways of the world. But the truth is, for over 100 years, religious sisters were the first, truest and best of the feminists. They were educated. They taught our children. They were heads of the hospitals and institutions of higher learning. They were women who could stand on their And they did. And they read and studied and they understood the Gospel call not only for mercy but for justice. And so many religious sisters began working with the poor and lobbying with their lives to change unjust structures. Obviously, more And sometimes differences within the reaction. communities.

In 1975, 90 sisters of Sister Marlene's order reformed themselves to become a new order attuned to the needs of the modern world. They called themselves the Sisters of the Living Word. Sister Marlene and her sister Eileen joined the new group..

Since Sister Marlene was an educator, she continued her education receiving her Master's Degree from the University of Notre Dame in Administration. She then became a principal of three different schools. Ten years ago she answered an ad for a parish in Elmhurst looking for an office manager. She answered it and... here she is. And what a joy she has been.

You can't call Mary Queen of Heaven without hearing the voice, "Mary Queen of Heaven, Sister Marlene speaking, how may I help you?" And while she has had many tough days, she has never really had a down day. She is like a true trampoline woman, you push her down and she pops right back up. She likes and loves everybody and does not have a prejudice bone in her body. She can drive you absolutely crazy but you could never stay mad at her because basically, she is one very happy, well-adjusted woman. And she is a woman of God.

Of the many hats that Sister wears here, one of the most important is her role in our "Protecting God's Children" program. She coordinates it, teaches it, and makes sure all of our important files and papers are up to date for the protection of our most precious gifts, our children. And the lady knows how to keep the files.


Sooner or later it will be filed away somewhere and sooner or later she will find it for you.


