Note from the Pastor



My new brothers and sisters in Christ, may God's peace be with you on this Solemnity of The Body and Blood of Christ! It is a great honor to have been chosen to be the next Pastor of Mary Queen of Heaven and I pray that God

will bless us as we journey together and grow to know our Savior who is with us whenever Mass is celebrated and He becomes present in the Eucharist.

You are likely wondering who this guy is who has been sent to be your pastor, so allow me to tell you about my journey to this day that has brought us together. I was born in North Palm Beach, Florida and lived there until I was twelve. Then, my family moved to Bloomington, Illinois where I lived until I graduated from high school. I studied pre-med biology at Augustana College in Rock Island, Illinois. A little class called Organic Chemistry got between me and medical school, so after college I moved to the Denver, Colorado area and continued work that I had begun as a volunteer during college as a medic.

It was there and while working in Medical Control at St. Anthony Hospital that I found myself helping to coordinate the response to the tragic and life-changing event that was the shootings at Columbine High School. Needless to say, when one experiences such a tragedy so closely, it causes one to look beyond the status quo and ask questions like "How could this happen?" and "Where is God in all of this?" What I came to realize as I journeyed through the emotions of that event was that the one thing that stands on the darkest days is faith and the important role the Church plays in providing healing and support on the most challenging of days.

That realization and many prayers led me to realize my own call to be a minister of healing as one who helps others to find faith in the God who loves and cares for us and who is always there for us when we open our hearts to Him in prayer.

And so I began formation to be a priest. I began my studies at St. John Vianney Seminary in Denver, but realized the need to be closer to my own family and transferred to Mundelein Seminary where I finished my formation to become a priest. I was ordained in 2010 at the Cathedral of St. Raymond in Joliet. The Cathedral was also my first assignment and I served there for two years. I then moved to St. Raphael Church in Naperville where I served for the past two years.

Today begins a new chapter for me and for the parish community of Mary Queen of Heaven. I am excited and humbled to be your new pastor as we enter into this new chapter of our lives, cared for by the loving motherhood of Mary, Queen of Heaven. I am looking forward to meeting all of you, praying and celebrating with you, and learning from you how God has blessed your lives and this community.
