

Obituary for Rev. John Barrett



In your prayers, please remember Rev. John Barrett, who passed from this life on July 16, 2014. John Barrett was born on April 24, 1933 in Chicago to Francis Joseph Barrett and Hildegarde Cecilia Parr, and was baptized at St. Petronille Parish in Glen Ellyn. He attended St. Petronille Parish Elementary School, Quigley Preparatory School in Chicago and St. Mary of the Lake Seminary in Mundelein. Following ordination to the priesthood by Bishop Martin D. McNamara on May 30, 1959 at the Cathedral of St. Raymond, Joliet, Father John Barrett was assigned to Sts. Peter & Paul Parish in Naperville. Subsequent assignments as parochial vicar include Notre Dame Parish in Clarendon Hills (1964) and St. Alexander Parish in Villa Park (1969).

Father Barrett was named pastor of Notre Dame Parish in Clarendon Hills (1972); St. Alexander Parish in Villa Park (1984) and Mary Queen of Heaven Parish in Elmhurst (1996). Father ministered at Mary Queen of Heaven Parish until his retirement in March of 2004. In addition to his pastoral responsibilities, Father Barrett served as Dean of the East DuPage Deanery and as a member of the Diocesan Pastoral Council.

In Memory of Rev. John Barrett

Last Monday, many of the parishioners of Mary Queen of Heaven along with many of the priests and faithful of the Diocese of Joliet gathered at Saint James Church in Glen Ellyn to pray, share memories, and give thanks for the ministry of Rev. John Barrett.

I will always remember him for his little book of numbers. He knew each priest by name, age, and ordination date as he was concerned for how we would continue to provide priests to cover our parishes. Even before I was ordained, he was warning me that I would be a pastor in record time. I was struck that it was not out of fear or cynicism that he tracked our staffing levels, but out of care for the Church and a desire to ensure that her members would be ministered too long after he was no longer able to minister.


Fr. John's impact on the history of Mary Queen of Heaven is much deeper than the beautiful gathering space we have thanks to his leadership and is evidenced in the memories that others have shared with me. Deacon Tom shared with me that Father Barrett was a good and close friend to him, whose ongoing care, fine Irish sense of humor, and example of remaining true to his faith even in the storms of life strengthened Deacon Tom's own faith. Mimi Nolan remembers his impact on her ministry, and how he created a family atmosphere, empowering the different members of the family to share their gifts with

the community. Mary White described him as one who was "very compassionate, loving, and caring. He always looked out for others even in difficult times." Finally, Rose Wilkes recounted his personal approach at her husband's funeral and the wisdom he shared: "Death ends a life but it does not end a relationship."

Although death has ended the earthly life of Rev. John Barrett, it did not end his relationship with us, nor does it end his priesthood. As he cared for us and the Church in this life, no doubt he is doing so from heaven. I imagine he is standing in front of God with that little book today, advocating for more shepherds to be provided to care for us whom he shepherded so well. Eternal rest grant onto Rev. John Barrett, O Lord. May he find rest from his labors, for he was a good and faithful servant.

Note from the Pastor



The Eucharist

In the Gospel this week, Jesus compares the kingdom of heaven to a treasure and a pearl of great price. When one finds something of great

value, one will go to great lengths to obtain it and to protect it. What we value say a lot about us, as does how we treat and care for those things of value that we treasure.

As Catholics, there is nothing we should value more than the Eucharist. In those hosts which we receive every Sunday is the real and true presence of Jesus himself. We do not see Him there, except with eyes of faith. We believe in faith that something special happened on the night that He was betrayed, as He took bread and wine and said "This is My Body, this is My Blood." We believe in faith that the Holy Spirit, when called down by the priest with the same words, consecrates the bread and the wine into the Body and Blood of Christ. We believe that when we receive that Eucharist, we are brought as close to God as is possible before death. Catholics throughout the ages have valued that presence of Jesus in the Eucharist so much that many have paid great prices to receive it. In addition, to show how much we value Jesus in that Eucharist, great respect and protection is given to hosts leftover after communion. That is why hosts are kept with special care in the tabernacle.

Because the Eucharist is of such great value to us, special procedures are required for its distribution and transportation. The Church realizes that not everyone can come to a Mass to receive the Eucharist. She has always made sure that those who are prevented from attending Mass due to extended illnesses or other disabilities can still receive on a regular basis. In many parishes, this has become a beloved ministry for trained Ministers of Care. After training in the proper handling of the Eucharist and the skills needed to provide pastoral care, they are able to take the Eucharist to the sick, visit with them, pray with them, and minister the Eucharist to them.

If you read the April edition of <u>Christ is Our Hope</u> you may have seen the decree by Bishop Conlon regarding the norms for the transport of the Eucharist to the sick and homebound. Bishop Conlon is asking all

of the parishes of the Diocese to ensure that we are following the norms of the Church in transporting the Eucharist. None of the norms he detailed are new nor are they a change. The bishop has simply reminded us that no one is permitted to take the Eucharist outside of the Church, unless they are trained and directed by their parish to do so as part of a ministry of care program.

Here at Mary Queen of Heaven, Deacon Tom Nolan is our coordinator of care for the sick and homebound. If you know someone who cannot attend Mass, please contact Deacon Tom through the parish office. Either he or I would be happy to bring the Eucharist to your loved one and ensure ongoing care. We are also looking for more ministers to be involved in this important ministry. In addition, Elmhurst Hospital is looking for volunteers to bring Eucharist to the sick there. Please contact Deacon Tom if you are interested in either opportunity for ministry.

The Eucharist is a holy treasure. We are blessed to have such easy access to Jesus himself. May we always protect and value that presence, because how we treat what we value says a lot about who we are.


