Q A

Luke's Gospel is the only one to mention the Presentation of the Lord in the Temple. What is Luke trying to communicate here and what connection does it have with Mary?

February 2 is exactly forty days after December 25, the nativity of Jesus. Jewish law (Ex 13:2, 12) dictated that Jesus, as the firstborn, be consecrated to God. This was done by the parents as they presented their Son in the Temple.

Jewish law further specified (Lv 12:2-8) that a mother was ritually impure after giving birth, and that she had to wait a set period of time (forty days for a boy) before she was to offer a sacrifice to the Lord for purification.

The convergence of these two Jewish regulations occasions Luke's account of both the Presentation of the Lord and the Purification of Mary. These days the liturgical emphasis is more on the Presentation of Jesus. Luke highlights the role of Simeon and Anna, two righteous Jews who recognized Jesus as the long-awaited Messiah and praised God for being able to see and experience such a marvel in their lifetimes. Simeon's prayer concerning the special role of Jesus states that Jesus is "a light for revelation to

Simeon's prayer concerning the special role of Jesus states that Jesus is "a light for revelation to the Gentiles." This phrase eventually originated the custom of blessing candles on this day which were to be used in the ceremonies, rituals, and processions throughout the church year. Thus February 2 is also known as Candlemas Day. This day is indeed a rich feast to be savored.

The Blessing of Throats

February 3rd is the feast of St. Blaise.

The Blessing of Throats will occur after all Masses this weekend as well as on the feast day.

Q

A special blessing of throats occurs on the feast of St. Blaise, February 3. What is the origin of this?

A

St. Blaise, Biagio in Italian, Blasco or Blas in Spanish, was a bishop of Sebaste, Armenia, in modern Turkey, who was martyred for witnessing to the faith. He was tortured and beheaded for his beliefs by the local Roman governor around AD 316. This is all that is known about him, the rest being legend. We know much more about devotion to and the popularity of St. Blaise than historical facts.

The special blessing of throats associated with St. Blaise is due to a miracle attributed to him. While in prison, he miraculously saved a boy choking on a fish bone. Early in the sixth century, evidence exists in the Eastern Church that Blaise was prayed to for aliments of the throat. To this day, his feast is a holy day in the Eastern Church. In the ninth century, veneration of St. Blaise came to the Western Church and became very popular. Blessing of the throats with crossed candles began in the 1500s, the height of devotion to St. Blaise, and that blessing is still part of the devotion of the Catholic Church.

No matter what the facts are, St. Blaise is a constant reminder to us of God's care and concern for us in our weakness, sickness, and limited human existence. God's healing touch is with us always. St. Blaise's celebration is one of the ways in which we highlight and thank God for that care and concern.

What's Cooking in RCIA??

It is time to get the parish family up to date with the happenings in the **R**ite of **C**hristian Initiation of **A**dults (RCIA). In life, we are aware of one thing... CHANGE! This is also true in the Church as our liturgical leaders work to create more meaningful experiences of worship.

In the very early Church, the Sacrament of Baptism was an "adults only" affair and celebrated each year on the night of the Easter Vigil. It was a very big deal! Still is! Through the years, adult candidates coming into the Church from other Christian traditions were brought in along with the catechumens. It became a bit of a hodge podge of confusion.

We are now asked to keep the various groups in separate celebrations. Only those adults who seek Baptism along with Confirmation and Eucharist, will be brought in at the Easter Vigil. We have no adults seeking Baptism this year so our Easter Vigil will be somewhat different (a little shorter for starters!).

MQH will be welcoming three adults to the Sacraments of Confirmation and Eucharist:

Joan Letourneau is a Catholic completing her Sacraments of Initiation by being confirmed in the faith and receiving Eucharist for the first time. Teresa Stockman was Baptized in another Christian tradition, and now seeks full communion with the Catholic Church by being Confirmed and also receiving her First Communion. Both women will receive these Sacraments at the 8:30 Mass on April 19.


