

A NOTE FROM FATHER JASON

Every year, we begin Lent with Sunday meditations upon temptation and transfiguration. The middle three Sundays of Lent vary, but for those preparing to receive the sacraments for the first time at Easter, it is a time of final preparation. Over these three weeks, the elect enter into a process called the Scrutinies. There are three proper Masses that are celebrated for them to help them reflect upon and prepare for the sacramental life into which they are

about to enter. These Scrutiny Masses include prayers for the elect, a rite through which the community prays for them, and the Year A Lenten Gospel Passages, which are the Woman at the Well, the Man Born Blind, and the Raising of Lazarus.

The RCIA ritual directs that those seeking to be cleansed in baptismal waters at Easter go through Scrutinies "to uncover, then heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect; to bring out, then strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good" (RCIA 141). For the elect, the power of this Lenten call to examine our lives, seek healing, and then experience the Lord's power to give new life is as profound as the sacraments they will receive for the first time. For the rest of us, whose sacraments of initiation are at best a dim memory, it may seem that we are beyond such a conversion. That temptation must be put aside! Each of us are called every year though our practice of Lenten disciplines to reconnect to the grace of our initiation and to enter more deeply into it by precisely this same process of examination, healing, and resurrection. The Sacrament of Reconciliation provides a fruitful context by which we are helped to break the cycle of going to the same empty well so that we can be free to seek the life giving water that is the grace of our baptism.

Whether this Lent brings you to the life giving water of baptism for the first time or if you are longing to see the fruits of your efforts to life our your baptism, May God bless you with the courage to uncover what is hidden and openness to the healing only he can give, so that you may know and see the new life of resurrection that baptism into the Christian life provides.

LENTEN Q & A

COMMONLY ASKED QUESTIONS DURING LENT

- Q. I've noticed that restaurants and grocery stores advertise specials on expensive types of fish and seafood on Fridays during Lent. Some of my Catholic friends take advantage of these deals, but somehow I don't feel right treating myself to the lobster special on Fridays during Lent.
- A. While fish, lobster and other shellfish are not considered meat and can be consumed on days of abstinence, indulging in the lavish buffet at your favorite seafood place sort of misses the point. Abstaining from meat and other indulgences during Lent is a penitential practice. On the Fridays of Lent, we remember the sacrifice of Christ on Good Friday and unite ourselves with that sacrifice through abstinence and prayer.

REPORTING INCIDENTS OF SEXUAL ABUSE


EUCHARISTIC ADORATION MONDAY MARCH 7

The Living Stations is a prayerful performance of the Stations of the Cross.


All 6th and 7th grade RE students are invited to participate in the Living Stations of the Cross.
