

A NOTE FROM FATHER JASON

One of our Gospel options for this weekend is that of the Prodigal Son, one of the most well known and well beloved parables in scripture. Perhaps we are drawn to this story because of its vivid presentation of a story we all know too well... grasping to possess too soon, realizing we have messed up and squandered our lives, and then realizing the need to return to God for forgiveness. The image of the father at the son's return is a poignant one and a good image to consider as we journey through

Lent. The father goes out to meet the son. He does not question what happened to the son. He simply welcomes him back, overjoyed to see him and to have him home again. What a comforting image for us as we examine our lives and consider what aspects of our own lives need to be returned to the Father. He will be there waiting for us, arms outstretched and ready to celebrate with us. We only need to, like the son, realize our mistake and take the first steps back toward God. He will then do the rest.

The word prodigal means lavish and profuse, even wasteful. Although usually attributed to the son's behavior as he wastes his inheritance, perhaps the more prodigal character in the story is the father. After all, what is more overboard than to call a feast for someone who wasted a gift you gave them? The father is even more than generous in his response to the other son, reminding him that everything I have is already yours.

As we journey through the desert of Lenten penance and examination of our lives, let us remember this image of the father. In these days of moderation and repentance, it is easy to let ourselves fall into the mindset that God wants us to suffer, that we are being punished, or that the spiritual life is only a demanding set of rules. The image of the prodigal father, who wants us to have everything we need to turn away from this world's promises of prodigal rewards that only bring emptiness toward the father whose lavish grace never disappoints.

May God bless you with the faith, hope, and love that you need to see your heart's need to return to Him, our prodigal Father, who is watching and waiting for our return.

LENTEN Q & A

COMMONLY ASKED QUESTIONS DURING LENT

- **Q.** I understand that Catholics ages 18 to 59 should fast on Ash Wednesday and on Good Friday, but what exactly are the rules for these fasts?
- A. Fasting on these days means we can have only one full, meatless meal. Some food can be taken at the other regular meal times if necessary, but combined they should be less than a full meal. Liquids are allowed at any time, but no solid food should be consumed between meals. Invalid, pregnant and nursing mothers are exempt.
