

A NOTE FROM FATHER JASON

This weekend we celebrate the feast of Pentecost. On this day, fifty days after Easter, we focus on the sending of the Holy Spirit. I was recently told of how in a grade school class, they were discussing the tongues of flame that appeared and the teacher asked "What would you say if you saw tongues of flame appear over your friends?" One child's answer: "Stop, drop, and roll."

Some of you probably remember how the Holy Spirit used to be referred to as the Holy Ghost. References to spirits and ghosts may lead us to think more of Halloween gremlins and ghouls than the person of the Trinity, whose presence in our lives we celebrate today. After all, if Casper was the friendly ghost, then maybe part of God could be the Holy Ghost.

The third person of the Trinity was not called the Holy Ghost because it was a spirit left to haunt us. In the early Greek scriptures, the word used for spirit was *pneuma*. As it was translated into German and English, the translation was not exact as Spirit and Ghost both were acceptable translations. However, *pneuma* refers more to the life breath of God. Scripture uses that image of the breath of God when life is being given. Genesis says that God breathed the breath of life into Adam. When Jesus commissions the apostles, He breathes on them and says, "receive the Holy Spirit."

Our celebration of Pentecost reminds us that the Holy Spirit is not a cause for fright, not a disembodied force roaming the earth, and not just a sign of holiness burning over our heads. It is the life giving force of God, which gives us the wisdom, strength, and holiness to do and say the right thing so that we may live the life that has been breathed into our hearts to the fullest. Whether you call Him Holy Ghost or Holy Spirit, He is in your hearts giving you life and holiness.

Come, Holy Ghost, creator blest, and in our hearts take up your rest!

REDISCOVER JESUS - JESUS WAS A RADICAL (CHAPTER 8)

Point to Ponder: Ask Jesus to help you get to the root of things in your life. Ask him to help you embrace the truth.

Verse to Live: "Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus." PHILIPPIANS 2:5

Question to Consider: When was the last time you had the courage to seek out the root of an important issue?

Prayer: Jesus, point me toward the root of things, and give me an extra nudge when I am tempted to settle for the shallow and the superficial.

Parishioner Reflection: Jo Styler

I don't think Jesus would have been a fan of "small talk." The radical way of Jesus doesn't mean extreme or revolutionary, instead it means getting to the root, core or heart of the matter. Jesus sought the essential and valuable in life; surrendering His will to the Father put everything in divine order. Not to be focused on the periphery, but on the heart of the matter is radical.

Jesus wasn't swayed by opinions or concerned about how His words or actions would be taken. Jesus never danced around the truth. Truth is radical.

I imagine when people encountered Jesus with their sorrows, yearning for answers, or a cure, they didn't hem and haw. Words came, tears flowed, hearts changed. There is nothing mediocre about the way Jesus loved. Love is radical.

Choose any teaching of Jesus in Scripture, whether it is the Pharisee who try to trip Him up, or the Samaritan woman at the well. Those dynamic encounters hit a crescendo when Jesus simply tells the Pharisee, 'Give to Caesar what is due Caesar, and give to God what is due to God.' Or when Jesus reveals to the Samaritan woman that He is the water she thirsts for and will never be thirsty again.


We are called to be radical like Jesus. I have been beginning my day by asking God, "What do YOU want me to do today?" I ask for the grace to see Christ in all I encounter and that I act Christ-like to all who encounter me. Being mindful that God is present in the interruptions, the surprises in the day, and the work itself causes me to seek Jesus in the heart of the matter. Radical, huh?
