A NOTE FROM FATHER JASON



As we reflect on the Holy Trinity this weekend, we are reminded of the three different persons contained in one God. We also call to mind that the three form a communion of persons, God fully present in each and no one person acting or existing without the others. As the Father creates, the Son saves, and the Spirit leads us to the truth of our being, made in God's image and likeness and called to participate in the work of creating and saving the world in many varied ways.

Often we are reminded that others show us the face of Jesus. Certainly in the faces of the poor, we do see Him and should be moved to care. The Gospel is clear that any care that is given to the least is just as powerful as love shown to God himself. It is certainly a humbling thought. But, for today, as we marvel in the varied persons of Trinity, perhaps we should look around and consider the face of God made apparent in each person around us. After all, each of us is made in God's image and likeness. Certainly we can then see God in everyone, even those who do not look needy. Do you know someone creative, a life giver, one who is always providing for others? You are seeing God the Father in them. Do you know someone who is always saving the day, calling others to love, giving what they have? You are seeing Jesus the Savior in them. Do you know someone filled with wisdom and understanding, charity, strength to overcome? You are seeing the Spirit of God in them. Look around, see the face of God in those around you (and yourself). And remember, just as the three persons of the Trinity are always together and indivisible, His image is present in some measure in each of us. Just because someone is full of the Father's creativity, does not mean they do not have some measure of the Spirit's wisdom. Unlike God, who is perfect and the fullness of each person at all times, we are imperfect beings and have been created with more gifts in one area than others.

There is beauty in this imperfection in our characters. What we lack, others have in abundance. This variety does not mean one is better than the other, but causes us to come together to support each other. As we do that, we become a communion of persons, brought together by the image and likeness of Him who is the perfect communion of persons.

Oh Most Holy Trinity, undivided unity. Holy God, Mighty God, God Immortal be adored!

THANK YOU MESSAGE FROM JUDY FUSHEN



I am back from Bolivia and filled with the Holy Spirit! This was a great trip. So much was done, learned and shared. There were over 60 surgeries performed at the hospital. 90 women received water filters and equipment from the *Water with Blessings Team*. A soup kitchen and pre-schools were given food (with meat) and teaching supplies. Every day we would take a 2 1/2 to 4 hour bus ride to and from our medical clinics out into the mountains. These clinics were held in community buildings, old schools and deserted buildings. We served between 120 - 180 adults and children every day. Awesome! We ran out of vitamins on the 3rd day. The construction team built a bathroom and did painting at the only handicapped hospital for children in all of Bolivia. We are also working to rehab a handicapped bathroom with large pulleys and things to help the children with bathing. Thanks again for all your help and prayers! REDISCOVER JESUS - THE GREATEST TEACHER EVER (CHAPTER 9)


Take Time with the Teacher!

I remember some great teachers I had growing up. These teachers were able to synthesize the complex right down to the heart of the matter in a comprehensible way. These teachers used their own teaching talents, mnemonics, patterns, and graphic organizers to demonstrate how the whole theme points to the radical, or central idea.

The Gospels show how Jesus is a Master Teacher. *Lectio Divina* which is Latin for Divine Reading is a prayerful way to explore the teachings of Jesus. Taking time to consider the Gospel's meaning for me is a way to meditate, or contemplate Jesus' message. Taking time to come away with Jesus to seek His radical message is imperative to developing a lifelong relationship with Jesus as a disciple.

The simple prayerful steps of *Lectio Divina* are:

- Lectio:** Spend time reading over the Scripture text a few times letting the message sink in.
- Meditatio:** Reflect on its meaning for my life today with an openness to hear God's message.
- Oratio:** Let my heart speak to God about the Scripture message.
- Contemplatio:** Listen deeply to hear how God calls me to transformation.
- Actio:** Go and live that transformation with others.


