

Marriage Ministry---

"I do". Simple words that change lives forever. One day you're foot loose and fancy free, dating, dining, and dancing. The next day, you have a house and mortgage and 2.5 children! And it all happens by saying, "I do".

But when couples say "I do" what are they committing themselves to? That is what the Marriage Ministry tries to help engaged couples discover, love, sacrifice, friendship and willingness to grow together, as a couple. The Marriage Ministry helps engaged couples to discern, discover and discuss various aspects of marriage. We help them understand that the Sacrament of Marriage is a commitment of being witnesses to God's love.

The ministry does this by facilitating the "Focus Program" for engaged couples in our parish. The program brings together trained mentor couples with those newly engaged. The mentors help the engaged to explore the various aspects of what it means to be truly married. Topics such as family, spirituality, covenant, children, careers, finances and, yes, even fighting, or as we like to say 'communication' are explored. The time spent together in sharing and laughing enriches not only the engaged coupled but the married mentors as well. It is truly a rewarding ministry.

The ministry, however, takes people. Married couples who are willing to share their lives and experiences with others. They are those who are willing to do God's work and change lives. Are you one of these couples? Because if you are, we need you. The commitment is light. Couples meet perhaps 2-3 times. Training is provided by the Family Ministry of Joliet Diocese. The next training session meeting takes place in early October. Support is on going from other mentor couples and the Marriage Ministry. If you are interested, we would be happy to speak with you and share more information.






