

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER JASON



Mary Queen is blessed to have a small group of very dedicated volunteers who give of their time and talents to support the parish's mission of building the Kingdom of God in North Elmhurst. They serve God by taking an active role in liturgy, catechizing our youth in religious education, caring for our grounds, assisting the teachers in the preschool, counting the collection, leading adult faith groups such as CRHP or small groups, preparing candidates for sacraments, comforting the grieving, visiting the sick, and providing food community events. I am grateful for their selfless and tireless efforts to serve the Body of Christ that is Mary Queen. I am sure the Lord is grateful as well, since He said, "whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me." (Mt 25:40)

It is not uncommon in the Catholic Church for a small percentage of the people to be doing the majority of the work. Since my arrival two years ago, I have been concerned with the small number of parishioners who are involved in a volunteer role. It is a problem we have discussed and we have attempted to implement new strategies to encourage involvement. Unfortunately, the number of volunteers has continued to decrease. As the number of volunteers has decreased, the faithful remnant has been called upon to serve more. This has led to a second loss of volunteers who are burning out due to an inability to meet the demands. As other parishes are struggling as well, our experience is likely connected to the cultural change where volunteerism and involvement is not as valued as it used to be.

I bring this up because the rosters of two of our liturgical ministries have become depleted to the point that some action needs to be taken as the schedule can no longer be filled. These areas are Eucharistic Ministry and Altar Servers. In order to allow for those who want to serve to be scheduled without being overwhelmed, I am decreasing the number of both ministries at all weekend Masses, effective July 1st. In order to decrease the number of Eucharistic Ministers, the two Cup Ministers in the back will be eliminated. If you sit in the back sections and would like to receive the Precious Blood, you will still be able to do so by proceeding up the middle and joining a line at the front of the Church. The number of scheduled Altar Servers will be decreased from three to two at 4:30 pm and 10:30 am and no servers will be scheduled for 8:30 am. At any Mass, if a server is present and would like to serve in order to bring the number up to three, he or she will be welcome to volunteer.

I regret to have to make these cuts, but in order to preserve the volunteers that remain, they are necessary. We are planning recruitment drives again this fall. Perhaps if more step forward to help, the changes will be temporary. Any confirmed Catholic over the age of 16 in good standing with the Church is eligible to be a Eucharistic Minister. Any child who has received 1st communion and entered the fourth grade is eligible to serve until they graduate High School. (One of our problems with server retention is the mistaken belief that you are excused from serving after confirmation... this belief is false). Please consider if the Lord is calling you to take ownership of your faith by taking an active role in your parish. Thank you to all who add so much to our community through your service of Mary Queen.

A plenary indulgence frees a person from all of the temporal punishment due to sins and may be gained only once on any one day. Indulgences are only applicable to oneself and to the dead.


How can one obtain a plenary indulgence during the Year of Mercy?
