A Message From Father Jason

In this weekend's gospel, we hear the story of the ten lepers who were healed. Nine do not return to Jesus, but one does return directly to Jesus and gives thanks for the gift of healing that he received. The story reminds us that being thankful means doing something more than saying "thank you." That may be an appropriate response when someone holds the door for us, but it must echo hollow when said in response to a gift as big as our life, our salvation, and the many blessings that God gives us each day. We know we are called to return to God, to change our

lives, work on overcoming sin, and give of ourselves to help others. We offer this kind of return not because we were told to do so, but because we know what great gifts God has given us and we want to use our lives to say "thank you" well.

The reflection question for us, then, is the popular: "What if you woke up tomorrow with only that which you thanked God for today?" Busy people that we are, would any of us have much left tomorrow? Luckily for us, God does not give gifts only to take them away if we do not say thank you. However, he is patiently waiting for us to make that return of giving thanks.

Good news! If you are reading this after Mass, you have already done something to give thanks. After all, Eucharist means thanksgiving. Our participation in the Mass is a way that we return to God and give thanks for the healing He has given us. Being at Mass is only the beginning of our call to give thanks. You are blessed with the opportunity to take an active role at Mass, by singing in choir, being an usher, a Eucharistic Minister, Lector, or Altar Server. Are you one of the 1/10 of people who make use of this opportunity to be active in your giving thanks at Mass? When you are not at Mass, do you see others as a gift to your life and treat them in a way that lets them know you are thankful? Do you allow your gratitude to move you to engage in works of mercy and charity?

There are indeed many ways to return to Jesus in gratitude for the gifts we have been given. Let us seek God's help to open our hearts to doing more than saying thanks. Let us resolve to become a people who live lives of thanksgiving more and more each day.

It has been brought to my attention that a group calling themselves "evangelical catholics" is renting space in a building in our neighborhood and advertising in a local newspaper. I have researched the group and consulted with Bishop Conlon's office. Although they do advertise themselves using terms like mass and sacraments that sound Catholic, they are not. They are a group that was founded by a dissident bishop from South America and neither their diocese nor their local parish is in union with the Roman Catholic Church or the Diocese of Joliet. I strongly recommend that you do not participate in the activities of this group. Please join me in praying for them and all who find themselves unable to participate in the life of the One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church, that the Lord would provide the healing they need and gather all of His lost sheep back into the flock.

Celebrate It!




