## Note from the Pastor

We welcome Father Burke Masters, the Vocation Director for the Diocese of Joliet, who will be preaching at all the Masses this weekend and speaking to our teens. He shares with us today his remarkable vocation story and invites us all to listen to that small, still voice of God as we are *all* called to our own particular vocation. His emphasis, obviously, will be on the particular call and vocation to the priesthood and religious life.

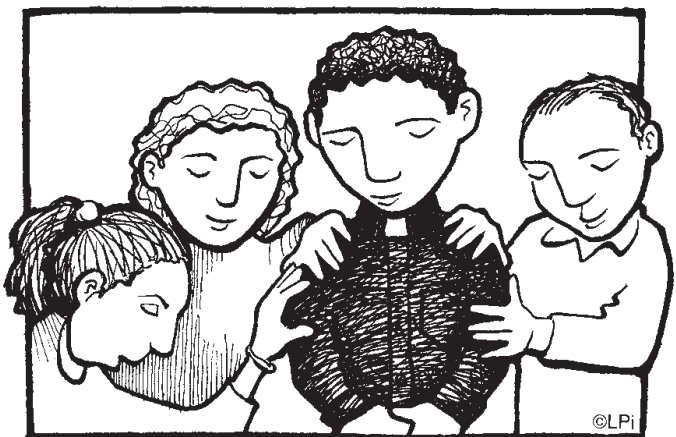
There is an old saying (well, not that old, I wrote it) that says you never need a priest...until you need one. At that point, no one else will do. For 99% of what goes on in our lives we can manage by ourselves (and with the help of others) quite well, thank you very much. Even in the majority of the work of the Church we have delightfully learned that an empowered laity can do the vast majority of what must be done. It is an obvious work of God's Holy Spirit that the laity have taken such a wonderful role of leadership in ministry, teaching and formation. At my last parish even the day to day administration of running the parish was done by an in creditably competent and holy layman. Why? For a lot of reasons. Obviously, with the decline in the number of priests and sisters we feared that our precious institutions (especially our catholic schools) would cease to exist. That did not happen. And while the number of our Catholic schools is fewer, it is not for lack of a committed and competent lay faculty. And this goes for all the areas of ministry from Religious Education to Adult Formation to the ministries of care and even counseling. The major reason this is happening, however, is that since Vatican II the laity have taken seriously their role in sharing this most holy work. We all have vocations to the priesthood. The Council called it the priesthood of the faithful.

But there is another calling within the calling, a vocation within the vocation and that is the vocation to be set aside as an ordained minister or consecrated religious. There is no doubt in my mind that God is continuing to call young men and young women to this state of life. One of the major reasons that vocations are down in the Church is that this call is becoming increasingly difficult to hear for the cacophony of noise with which we are continually surrounded. Last week God spoke to Elijah in a whispering voice. If there wasn't silence around him he would have never heard

it. And our young people live today in anything by silence. The major reason, however, that vocations to the priesthood and religious life are down these days is because God's voices are not longer calling. For centuries God spoke through religious sisters who would look out over their class and know intuitively which ones God was calling and she would name them and call them to religious life. Even mothers (especially Irish mothers) were very astute in naming which of their children were being called by God and they became God's voice to their children. Who is God's voice today? Who will call?

If we ever needed priests, we need them today. As Catholics we are first and foremost an Eucharist community. Send a protestant missionary to Africa and when he leaves, the people have a very nice protestant church. Send in a Catholic priest missionary to Africa and should he have to leave, he will leave behind him a very nice protestant church. Our whole Catholic identity is encompassed and encased in the Holy Eucharist. It is truly our life source. And it is the ordained priest that celebrates the Eucharist. We need him. Period. When we are dying, we need him. When we are baptizing our babies or celebrating our children's weddings, we need the ordained minister. And when we seek reconciliation with our God, nothing consoles like the words, "I absolve you." You see, you never really need a priest...until you need one. And when that happens, no one else will do.

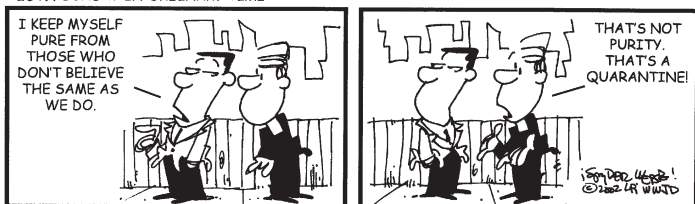
All sessions meet on Wednesdays. If you can help, please call the REO today. Classes begin in just a few weeks.
