Note from the Pastor

THE QUEENSHIP OF THE BLESSED VIRGIN MARY

Today we celebrate our Parish Feast Day with a special outdoor mass. The Feast of the Queenship of the Blessed Virgin Mary was first prescribed only in 1954 by Pope Pius XII. It didn't take long for two local institutions to adopt the name and the title; a close by cemetery and us (we got the better deal). The Feast was originally celebrated on the 31st of May, the last day of the Marian month. In recent years, however, it has been moved to the octave of the Feast of the Assumption, hence the actual Feast day was Friday, the 22^{nd} . No matter, we will celebrate the Blessed Virgin every chance we get.

I love Mary. I love the teenager from Nazareth who said the most profound words ever spoken by a human being, "Fiat, let it be". And from that simple word the Word became incarnate. The Divine Presence Power and Love became Flesh, one of us.

We, the human ones, are Mary. And we, the household of Mary Queen of Heaven, a little Catholic church on the northwest side of Elmhurst in the Diocese of Joliet in Illinois, take our very identity from her name and her title. To name someone and to give them a title is to identify them. And we have been named and titled. We are Mary Queen of Heaven Church.

What does that mean? I don't know. I am really not sure yet. But of this I am certain. It's an important name and a perplexing title. And so much of who we are as a community is tied up in that name and title. Names are really important. I tell young couples to name their children advisedly not following whatever may be the present fashion. God has already named the child in its mother's womb. And in our naming this sacred visitor from God, we give her or him their initial identity. In time, they will add to their name a title: Doctor, Lawyer, Indian chief. More Identity. What does it mean to be Mary? And more difficult, what does it mean to be the Queen of Heaven and Earth? And what does that say about us? I don't know... yet.

I do know this, however, in the economy of God nothing is wasted, everything is used, everything belongs. There really are no mistakes with God (well, he did make the avocado pit a little too big) from God's perspective. Even (and especially) the seeming failures in life are redeemed and turned into the truest revelation of life. From our lemons we make lemonade, from our deaths we are given life, from our losses, gain. Nothing is wasted, everything is used and especially our identities. What does it mean to be white (people of color), female (male), American citizen (undocumented immigrant), Elmhurstite (is that a word?, it's

better than Bensenvillian), Catholic, and a full-fledged, active, participating member of the household of Mary Queen of Heaven? It's our name and our title that speaks to us today.

Mary. It's not by mistake that the very first assignment I had in my priesthood was to Saint Mary's Church and my most likely last assignment is another Mary. What does that say and mean to me and how does that form my identity? And title. It is not by mistake that all three parishes in the city of Elmhurst are Marian parishes: the Visitation, the Immaculate Conception, the Coronation of Mary as Queen of Heaven and Earth. It is not by mistake that all three are joyful mysteries of the Rosary: the Annunciation, the Visitation, the Coronation. What does it mean? I must confess that I find the Visitation much easier to understand and identify with (I was alone and you visited me) and even the Immaculate Conception (the perfect vessel for the Redeemer of the World). But Queen? As a good red blooded American boy, I don't get the Queen thing (and I get the King thing even less). The title seems so regal, royal, unapproachable, and foreign to my experience and the real paradox of Mary.

Mary is the little one, the *anawim*, one of the poor of Yahweh. The littlest and the lowest I understand. It is to the little ones that the kingdom belongs. The poor are blessed. In Mary's battle hymn, the Magnificat, the lowly are lifted up, the hungry are fed. Yes, she does say that the lord has looked in the lowliness of his servant and then hence forth all generations will call me blessed. But what does that mean? And what does that mean for us? I just don't know.

So, on this our Feast Day, we have our work cut out for us. Who are we? Who are we as a Parish? And what does our name tell us about ourselves? As the little Roman Catholic Church on the northwest corner of the City of Elmhurst in the Diocese of Joliet in Illinois named Mary Queen, what does that mean? Let us delve into that mystery together.

person. Names will remain on the prayer list for four weeks.


