

Note from the Pastor

OUR STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN BEGINS

Dear Family of Mary Queen,

When Bishop Sartain announced that I was to be the new pastor of Mary Queen of Heaven in Elmhurst, I smiled and thanked God. In my 38 years of priesthood I have pastored both large and small, rich and poor parishes. All have had their delights and challenges but I must confess a prejudice toward the small. And while my heart will always be in favor of the poor, it was the middle class parishes that had the resources, both personal and financial to get things done in the proclamation of the Kingdom. For me, Mary Queen has the best of both worlds, small enough to be a true community of faith and resource rich enough to do something with that faith.

When I look around our parish I realize that much has been given to us and consequently much will be expected of us. In a nutshell that's what it means to be a steward and hence, our annual stewardship campaign. opportunity to give back to the Lord a portion of what we have received. When we take the time to think about it, we realize that we have received everything, all is gift: our life, our talent, the time we have on this earth, our relationship with loved ones and even our treasure. And what we receive as gift we must give back as gift. It's a spiritual law.

In the physical world when you give or use something up, it is gone. In the spiritual world, it's just the opposite. When you give and share faith and love and forgiveness, it comes back to you multiplied. You can't give it all away. It keeps coming back. It is the same way with our financial resources used for spiritual purposes. Give it away and watch it come back...multiplied.

Obviously this is an act of faith but we are people of faith. And in my short time I have witnessed wonderful actions of faith over and over again. I have experienced first hand your faithful stewardship of time, talent and most recently, treasure.

Walk in to Mary Queen on any given Wednesday afternoon and you can't help but be in awe of all the wonderful, holy activity as our little ones come to learn about the Lord at the hands and hearts of our teachers, volunteers and staff that make R.E. happen. Walk the grounds and you will see the talented and gifted artistry of gardeners, the painting and repairs made by our volunteer workers and the care our young mothers take in bringing

our smallest members to pre-school. Enter a meeting room or the church and you will find Bible study, adoration, silent prayer, sacristans cleaning and preparing for the sacred lituray, and commissions and committees aiving of their talent and time to make Mary Queen home. This is all stewardship and it vivifies the Body of Christ (that's us).

Generously giving our financial resources is also stewardship. Next week I will be writing to all our registered parishioners about the spiritual importance of sharing our material means. There are so many wonderful things that we should be doing and could be doing if we had but the means. But that's not the reason we give. I'll explain that later. In the meantime, stay open to God's Spirit given to you. The Spirit will instruct you in all things.

THE CHALLENGE OF FORMING CONSCIENCES FOR FAITHFUL CITIZENSHIP (PART 5 OF 6)

This brief document is a summary of the United States bishops' reflection Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship (www.faithfulcitizenship.org). It complements the teaching of bishops in dioceses and states. It is being presented by the MQH Peace and Justice Committee in six parts.

Option for the Poor and Vulnerable

While the common good embraces all, those who are in greatest need deserve preferential concern. A moral test for society is how we treat the weakest among us—the unborn, those dealing with disabilities or terminal illness, the poor and marginalized.

Dignity of Work and the Rights of Workers

The economy must serve people, not the other way around. Economic justice calls for decent work at fair, living wages, opportunities for legal status for immigrant workers, and the opportunity for all people to work together for the common good through their work, ownership, enterprise, investment, participation in unions, and other forms of economic activity.

Solidarity

We are one human family, whatever our national, racial, ethnic, economic, and ideological differences. Our Catholic commitment to solidarity requires that we pursue justice, eliminate racism, end human trafficking, protect human rights, seek peace, and avoid the use of force except as a necessary last resort.

Caring for God's Creation

Care for the earth is a duty of our Catholic faith. We all are called to be careful stewards of God's creation and to ensure a safe and hospitable environment for vulnerable human beings now and in the future.

Conclusion

In light of Catholic teaching, as bishops we vigorously repeat our call for a renewed politics that focuses on moral principles, the defense of life, the needs of the weak, and the pursuit of the common good. This kind of political participation reflects the social teaching of our Church and the best traditions of our nation.


