Note from the Pastor

FINANCIAL AND SPIRITUAL FREEDOM

Let me begin with a confession. I know very little about the complexities of finance. Anyone who sits on our excellent Finance Committee can tell you when the monthly statements are passed out with hundreds of financial figures on them, my eyes glaze over and my mind goes into a fog. I do, however, know one mega-financial principle and I know it and live it to the core of my being. It is this: spend less than you make or conversely, make more than you spend. As children of the depression, my mother and father lived this principle petrified of ever having to go into debt. My father's favorite financial saying was, "Son, if you can't buy it with cash money, you can't buy it." The only exception to this rule was when you bought something that appreciated in value like real estate or pipe organs. That's it. To be perfectly honest, that's how I run my personal finances and that's how I manage the finances of the parishes that have been entrusted to my stewardship. And that's how I intend to manage the money entrusted to us by the community of Mary Queen.

Debt is slavery. The freest 6 years I have ever lived were the ones I lived in poverty while pasturing the community of Sacred Heart in Hopkins Park, Illinois. On the day I arrived I discovered that the electricity was about to be cut off, the oil tank for the church's furnace was empty, the collection was \$25 a week, the Diocese was subsidizing the parish priest's salary and we had bingo. I immediately did three things: called the Diocese to cancel the subsidy, went to our Resale shop to get more winter coats and blankets and announced to the people that bingo was over. I will not proclaim to you out of the right hand side of my mouth that if you seek the kingdom of God, all things will be given to you besides and out of the left side of my mouth, do you want to get rich quick? One of the two had to go. I also told them that we were no longer receiving Diocesan subsidies and that if I was going to eat, they were going to have to feed me. The next morning, the old black matriarch, Barbara Bratton came into my little house, walked right past me into the kitchen, opened the refrigerator, looked inside and announced, "A fly would die in there." And the food came. And the following Sunday the collection went up to \$150. And someone from one of my old parishes paid off our electric bill and filled our tank. We dared to believe that God will take care of our needs (not greeds) and so He did.

We have been lied to. We were told that we could buy now and pay later. That's the lie our entire nation bought into and today we are reaping what we sowed. When a young couple comes in for marriage preparation, I tell them two things: the number one early cause of marriage breakup is financial and if you take this next bit of advice, I will save you over three quarters of a million dollars in your lifetime. Don't buy on credit. The next piece of financial advice I would give you is this, pay yourself first.

From the Wealthy Barber to Susie Orman, to even crazy Cramer we all hear the same thing. Pay yourself first. When the bills come at the end of the month, the first bill you need to pay is to yourself. You take 10% of your income and you put it away. My mother and father while never rich, were comfortable in their retirement. I asked them how they did it on my father's working class salary? The answer, a bond a week. Every week out of my father's pay check a U.S. savings bond was automatically purchased. Since it was money he never saw, he never missed it. It sat there in savings and accumulated. And when interest rates went crazy in the late 70s and early 80s, they did quite well, thank you very much. This, (pay yourself first) is a really good financial principle. To this I want to add an indispensable spiritual principle. Even before you pay yourself, pay God first.

Does God need our money? Absolutely not! We need to give much more than God needs to receive. This great counter intuitive truth is the key to true freedom and joy. I know of no truly generous people who are not filled with freedom and joy. The Lord puts it this way in the Sermon on the Mount, blessed are the merciful, for mercy shall be theirs. What is mercy? The free gift of all that you have and all that you are. That gift given freely, opens you up to receive the Divine Mercy which is gift without end. Hence, the great spiritual principle of paying God first. And the best way to do it? Probably automatically. Just as I automatically take money out of my salary to fund my I.R.A. so I have recently signed up to automatically pay my tithe to the Lord. Here at Mary Queen, we use the services of Parish Pay (Go to www.maryqueen.org and click on the Parish Pay logo found on the left hand side below the menu). For me, it is by far the easiest and most painless way to fulfill my commitment to pay God first. And if a Luddite like myself can do it, anyone can do it. Please seriously consider it.

Today is Stewardship Commitment Sunday. It is the day that we will tell the Lord what we intend to do. I wish to do no less. It is my intention to ultimately pay back or give away 10% of our Parish Revenues to the poor and charitable causes, 10% to our savings and then to run the day to day operation of the parish with the remaining 80%. At this point, we are not ready to make a full 10% commitment (our incoming revenues will not allow it). But we must begin with 3% or 4% or 5%. This is on the agenda for both our Parish Council and Finance Committee.

And the goal? Financial freedom, mercy, joy. And that's not half bad.




