Note from the Pastor

THANK YOU! THANK YOU VERY MUCH!



Thursday is Thanksgiving. It is the last true, pure holiday. Try as it may, Madison Avenue has not been able to co-opt the day except for selling maybe a few extra Butterball Turkeys.

It is a family day when parents, grandparents, brothers and sisters, nieces and nephews, and cousins all come together just to be with each other and give thanks. Little kids will run and play, big kids will watch others play...football. After dinner the in-laws will argue about politics followed by a snooze on the sofa thanks to turkey's magic ingredients. It's a good day.

It's a good day to remember and give thanks. Often one or the other members of the family will suggest that we list the things for which we are thankful. It is a wonderful practice. And so we enlist Irving Berlin's message and melody of "Counting my Blessings." This is a wonderful and laudable practice. One can not be grateful, truly grateful and depressed at the same time. It really is true, if you can't sleep, count your blessings instead of sheep and you'll be so amazed at the length of the list that you will soon doze off.

Now, to the good things for which we usually and easily give thanks may I make a bold suggestion? As well as the good, give thanks for the difficult, challenging, painful, and even bad things that seem to creep into our lives. This is not only counterintuitive but, at first glance seems crazy. Why would you give thanks for a seemingly evil? You are asking me to be grateful for my gout? Never. I didn't say it was easy but it is, especially if we can do it while it is going on, most helpful. The difficulty is that while I am having a terrible tooth ache, I am not thinking about praising God. I am thinking about my pain and, maybe, the dentist. It is only in retrospect that we can see some very negative things as beneficial. In the economy of God, nothing gets wasted. On the journey into the heart of the fullness of life, it is often the detours that help us the most. This, however, is always seen after the fact, not while we are going 50 miles out of our way.

God uses everything. Saint Paul puts it this way, "For

those who love the Lord, everything that happens, happens for the good." Then he adds, "In every circumstance, give thanks." Nice theology but does it reflect reality?

If God is the ultimate reality, it certainly does. The ultimate reality of God is Love. That simply means that God is in everything. He is present not only during our good times, but most especially during our bad times. In the midst of our pain and suffering is God. Is he taking it away? Not always. Will he take us through? That's a promise. Do you believe that? Then give thanks. To give thanks in the midst of suffering is what the scriptures call a sacrifice of praise. The last thing we think of doing is praising and thanking God and yet when we do we are categorically stating that we believe that there is a reality even greater than the pain and suffering I am going through at this moment and this reality is not utterly benign but a blessing. This releases in us whatever is blocking us from receiving God's healing grace. Now, the only way to know that this is true is to try it. It is the real audacity of hope. It is daring to believe that no matter what all shall be well.

This Thursday is Thanksgiving. As is our tradition at Mary Queen we will gather for Mass at 9:00 AM. It is one of the most wonderful masses of the year because even though it is not a holy day of obligation, it is a most holy day. It is the day when this community is truly able to celebrate Eucharist (Thanksgiving). Put your turkey in the oven, gather the kids and grandkids, and come, let us give thanks.

MQH GARDEN CLUB NEWS

Thanks to all who helped clean up our gardens around the church, school and the rectory on Saturday, November 1. Our crew included three young gardeners whose assistance was greatly appreciated! The rains cooperated so well this summer, we had little need to water fre-

quently. However, as we have now put the gardens to sleep for the winter, I want to thank everyone of our "crew" of 13 regular planting and general garden care members for all their help throughout the growing season.

A few additional updates include 1) the removal of the overgrown and/or almost dead shrubs in front of church by Chuck Dolesy and Jerry Cote, and 2) the removal of a tall shrub by the rectory due to needed plumbing work there. For safety reasons, we have filled the rectangular cement areas in the front of church with mulch for the winter. In Spring we will replace the mulch with soil and plan to plant some new evergreens and other perennials in this "barren" area. We are open to ideas of kinds of plants you may be interested in seeing there, with great consideration being given to deer resistant plants. If you see fences around our new shrubs on the south side of church, it's because they make a good meal for winter-hungry deer, and we are trying to keep the deer out. 3) We have a potential problem with gypsy moths as they are already in their cocoons on our lovely oaks around the rectory. We are monitoring this problem, and will be taking appropriate action in Spring to get rid of them before they produce their thousands of caterpillars, who crawl up the tree and can manage to defoliate the tree as they munch away.


