Note from the Pastor

SOME THOUGHTS ON FORGIVENESS



I love Advent. Next to Lent, Easter and Ordinary Time, it is my favorite Liturgical season. Advent is all about new beginnings. It is a chance to erase the slate of our bad choices and begin again...fresh, clean.

Advent is about getting ready for newborns and new life, new possibilities. But before we can enter into it fully, there is something indispensable we have to do. FORGIVE...ourselves and others. We must also ask for forgiveness.

Advent (the coming) and forgiveness go hand in hand since forgiveness is always for the sake of the future. No forgiveness and we keep sawing the wood of anger, self righteousness, resentment, and revenge in the same place forever. Nothing is more debilitating. We stay stuck in our misery.

In forgiveness, we are liberated. Nothing sets us as free as forgiveness. We are no longer heavy burdened, we are lighter than air and our life is all future. Sounds wonderful, doesn't it? So why is it so darn difficult to do?

I think, secretly, we love to be hurt and offended. It gives us a sense of moral superiority and righteous indignation. We love to play the victim. As long as you are the cause of my pain and the blame for my misery, I don't have to change. I can simply wallow in my misery and stay right where I am, stuck in the mire of unforgiveness. And I can hold you in contempt with moral impunity. The saddest part is, however, when I hold you in the jail of my mind; I imprison myself with enslaving thoughts that take me over. It's an ugly thing, not to mention a terrible waste of time and energy. And no one moves forward. The Bible has a word for this. It's called possession.

Next to healing the body, Jesus spends a lot of time casting out demons. So many seemed to be possessed by a malignant power that comes into them, that they can no longer control. This negativity has taken them...and us over. And the more you think about this anger, resentment, bitterness, hate and desire for revenge, the more it grows until it completely takes over all your waking moments and visits you in your dreams. Now, I am afraid that possession isn't only an ancient biblical concept. It's a reality that is destroying countless lives today.

So what's the cure? Expose it to the light, name it. Jesus was forever asking its name in the gospels, "What is your name?" "My name is Legion, hatred, murderous thoughts."

The church has a powerful weapon in the naming of the demon. It's called Confession. It is saying out loud what's buried down deep. "I am filled with pain and a sense of betrayal and I feel it every day and I lash out at those I love and I am becoming not a very nice person." That's a good confession and it's powerful.

But that's only step #1. After we name the demon, we need to cast it out. But to whom do we cast it? To the only one who has the power to do something with it, Jesus. Jesus took all our hatred, all our anger, all our sin and exposed it on the cross. He made it so we can all see it. St. Paul goes further, he says Jesus not only exposed our sin but became our sin. If, indeed, the wages of sin are death, then truly, by dying He destroyed our death. And by rising, forgave our sins to give us new life.

Ultimately, the only cure for possession is Possession. If nature and spirit abhor a vacuum, then when we expose and expel the negative, there is now room for the positive...The Christ living in us, taking us over, possessing us. Now there is forgiveness and now we have a future.

So what are you waiting for? What are you going to do with your pain and your hurt?

This coming Tuesday, December 2, at 7:00 PM in the church, we will have the opportunity to expose our wounds to Jesus. Only He can kiss them and make them whole. Many are the walking wounded and oh, how the Lord wants us healed! Why? Because there is work that needs to be done. The Kingdom must be proclaimed and lived and that can't be done if we are stuck in our sins.

Not only does the Lord want us individually healed, but our entire community of Mary Queen is in need of having her wounds salved. Why? Because the church of Mary Queen has work to do too.

Purpose to be here on Tuesday. I am told (and from my experience on Saturday afternoons) that forgiveness, confession and reconciliation is not our strongest suit. If there is to be a future, that has to change...now.




