# Note from the Pastor



I hate to wait. (It's a true character flaw.) As a graduate student there were courses at Indiana University that I refused to take because the enrollment line was too long. And I hate to keep people waiting. I don't know if you have noticed or not but at Mary Queen of

Heaven if we do nothing else, we start on time. To me it is a sign of respect for those who show up on time.

It's all about time. And waiting. For what? For what or, more accurately, Who's coming. Put them all together and you have the Holy Season of Advent. It's a rather strange season based upon what we are hoping for but is not yet here. And the paradoxical thing about it is that that which we seek we do not receive by going after but by...waiting. Letting it come to us. For 'can do' Americans and 'can do even better' suburbanites, that's tough stuff. The Holy season of Advent tells us, "Don't just do something, stand there." And wait. And I hate to wait. I know that patience is a virtue and that I must pray for it and so I do, "Lord, I want patience and I want it now!"

Obviously, I am not alone in my desire for patience. One of the most common complaints (sins) I hear in confession is that, "I have no patience with my children." (Read; I want them to grow up and be mature... Now!). I usually tell the penitent to pray for patience but warn them that this is a prayer that is always immediately answered. The moment you pray for patience, God will send someone or something into your life that will drive you right up the wall. When you ask Him what He is doing, he responds "I am teaching you patience. I am answering your prayer."

Another word for patience is the ability to wait and trust that what you hope for will come about (your children will grow up...and all too fast).

So what are we waiting for? Is it really going to be better on the other side of the rainbow? Or on the other side of the stop light? I hate to wait at stop lights. Recently I had been doing a spiritual exercise at the longest lights (turning left on Lake off West is interminable). While waiting for the light to change I ask myself, will I really be happier on the other side of the street? Can I be just as happy right here, right now? It's been a marvelous exercise and I recommend it for lowering blood pressure and stress levels.

And so we wait. And we hope. We wait and we hope that the economy will turn around, that our broken relationships will be healed, that our children will grow into the people we know they truly are, that all wars will end and that... Christmas will come. Oh come, oh come Emmanuel. We are waiting for you, we are hoping in you. How patient is God for him to wait for us to come around. How hopeful is God that we one day will truly see the light and be transformed into the people he created us to be. Can we do no less as we wait for him?
