

I used to be an Advent purist. No Christmas Carols, no decorations too early and the Christmas tree went up on the 24th. Then from the 25th all the way through to the Baptism of the Lord we would sing our little hearts out, every

Christmas Carol in the book. Make those poinsettias last 'till Lent. The only difficulty with being a liturgical puritan was that I was the only one. In the real world everyone had put their Christmas stuff away by New Years.

Now, if you want to decorate your tree two days after Halloween, knock yourself out. I've even given in to allow my grandchildren to listen to the LITE as I drive them to piano lessons (if I never hear Burl Ives sing have a 'Holly Jolly Christmas' again, it'll be just fine with me). I must be going soft in my old age.

Why the change? Because, like the song says, 'we need a little Christmas right this very minute, we need a little Christmas now!' That song was sung by the intrepid Auntie Mame when she discovered how bleak Christmas was looking because she had just lost everything she owned.

Well, we too, need a little Christmas...now! Alvin and the Chipmunks aren't the only ones who can hardly wait for Christmas. And it is more than just about having presents under the tree as it is having The Presence in our hearts.




So, of course, we want to rush the season. We can't wait. We are too alone and afraid. Turn on the LITE and listen to



Gospel Reflection

A mother is presented with an unexpected gift, and without thought of self immediately sets about to share it with the world. Gabriel has proclaimed that Mary not only is pregnant, but that she will give birth to the Savior of the world. Talk about unexpected gifts! We have a tendency to sometimes take this story matter-offactly, but perhaps during this final week of Advent, we might take a few moments to quietly reflect on Mary and how she immediately knew and freely accepted her role in being part of God's greatest gift.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church teaches us that Mary most perfectly embodies the definition of faith. From her humble acceptance of the angel Gabriel's news to her trust as her son-God's Son-was led to his death, reveals to us that a mother's faith and love can be perfect (CCC 148-149). In these last few days before Christmas, share in the joy of the season with your mother, even if it is only in her memory. If there has been a falling out, know that she has never stopped loving you; reach out to her, tell her you love her and that life begins today.
